A Festive First: Whole School Debate Afternoon

Miss Timblin and The Motivators

Thursday 18 December marked a truly memorable milestone for our school as we hosted our very first whole school debate – and what a fantastic event it was!

Each tutor group had nominated students to represent their group two weeks previously, and even the choice of candidates was approached with maturity.

Each year group researched a set topic in advance, preparing during tutor time in the weeks leading up to the event. It wasn't until the students were about to debate did they discover which side of the argument they would be on. This was chosen after a roll of the dice!

Round after round, students impressed judges and audiences alike with their ability not only to express their own views clearly and persuasively, but also to listen carefully, accept alternative viewpoints and counter arguments thoughtfully and maturely. The level of respect, reasoning and resilience on display was remarkable. However, the real challenge came in the final rounds: finalists were given a brand-new topic, minimal preparation time and still no fixed "side". This would once again be chosen with the roll of the dice.

These final debates pushed students even further. Year 7 brilliantly tackled "Has Christmas lost its true meaning?", while Year 8 delivered a thoughtful and passionate discussion on how schools can do more to support the environment. Years 9 and 10 rose impressively to some particularly challenging and controversial topics, both centred around the right to life, including debates on the assisted dying bill and abortion.

Their maturity, sensitivity and depth of understanding were exceptional.

The initial topics were:

- **Year 7: Animal testing**
- **Year 8: Gender stereotypes**
- **Year 9: Should we have an NHS?**
- **Year 10: Should the UK have ever left the EU?**

Selecting overall winners was no easy task. Our judges and Chair worked diligently, applying a strict set of criteria to ensure fair and careful decision-making.

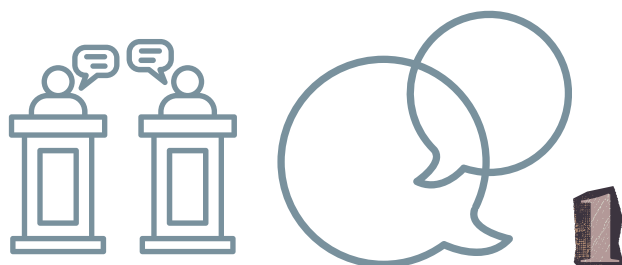

A wonderful way to end the term, and we can't wait for the next one!

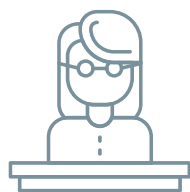


The Motivators

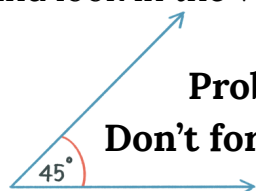

Congratulations to the year 11 students who are working so hard to improving their grades in their past paper practice.

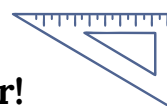

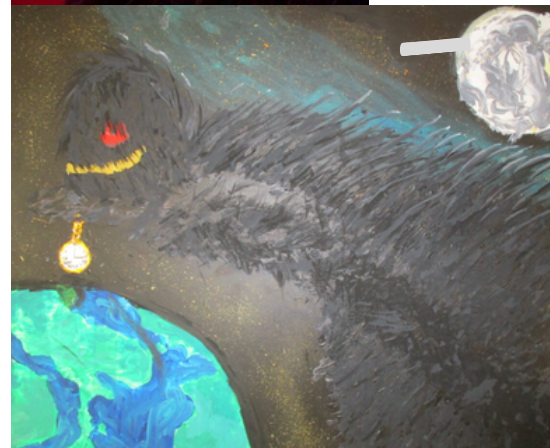
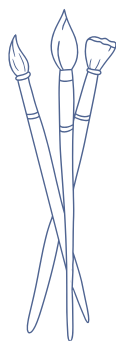


Mrs Hogg

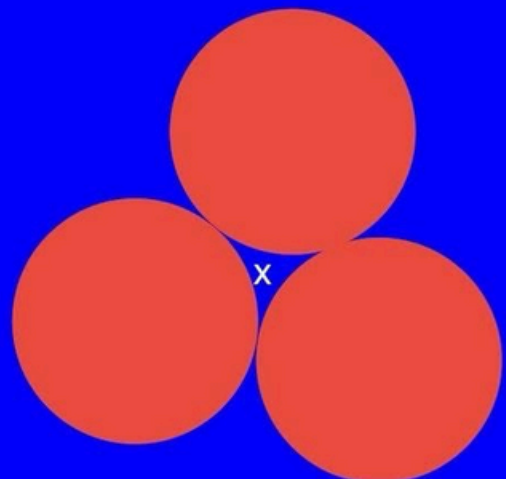
